# Total Assets increased by 20% between 2020 and 2021

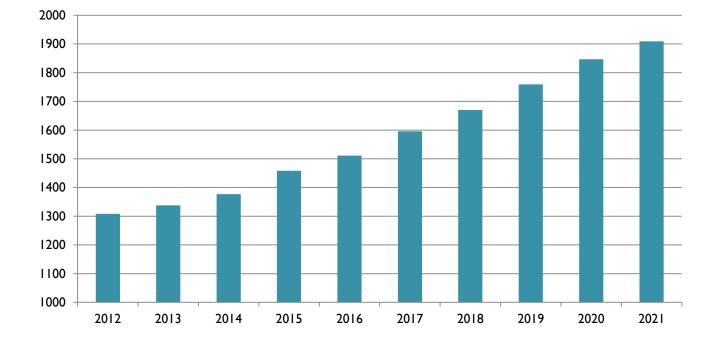

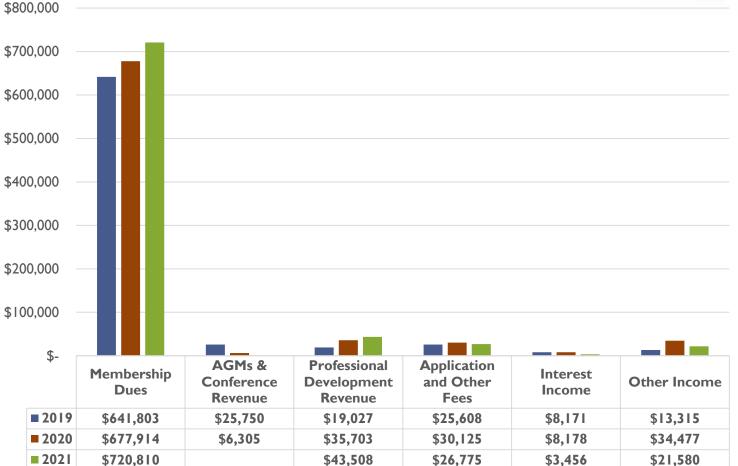
# 46% Increase in registration since 2012

In 2021, branches spent a total of \$15,866 of BCIA funds for Branch related functions and Branch professional development. This was 59% of the Branch allocations for 2021. Branches in 2021 were still navigating Covid restrictions but did manage to hold well received virtual sessions and webinars. The small costs associated with those generally came from the Provincial PD Resources budget as webinars are usually open province wide for Registrants. Some Branches were impacted by flooding and fires, which resulted in events being cancelled. Branches are continuing to look for creative ways to spend their annual allocations.
