Dear Registrants of the BCIA Fraser Valley Branch:

As of January 8, 2024, the Fraser Valley branch had 45 active articling registrants that included 38 Articling Agrologists (AAgs) and 7 Articling Technical Agrologists (ATAgs). Since the last branch AGM, there have been 22 new Articling Agrologists (AAgs) and 3 new Articling Technical Agrologists (ATAgs) added to the branch. Additionally, there were 9 registrants that completed their articling program requirements that included 7 registrants obtaining their Professional Agrologist (PAg) registration and 2 registrants obtaining their Technical Agrologist registration.
